Dear Friends,

It's official! I will be serving Hazel Park First UMC full time starting January 1st, 2024. Our partner church, St. Paul in Bloomfield Hills, has voted to merge with Troy First UMC. Since this is a midyear appointment change (very rare in our United Methodist circles), Troy has agreed to give Hazel Park the total of what my compensation and benefits would be until June '24. Those monies will be coming out of St. Paul's remaining assets. In other words, this is not going to cost Hazel Park very little of our own funds. Then, in July '24, it is likely we will be paired with another church. Ultimately, those decisions come at the discernment of the appointive cabinet.

I am excited to come and give Hazel Park my full-time efforts starting in January. While we will still be living in the St. Paul parsonage, I will be spending more time in the Hazel Park community. Truthfully, it has not been easy to balance our two churches in the past 18 months as these two communities of faith have gone in different directions. So being able to really focus on Hazel Park for a season will be of benefit to all of us. I am so grateful for how you have received me for the past 18 months. Your words of kindness and support have not gone unnoticed. We are a unique community, and it is a privilege to serve as your pastor. Starting in January, I look forward to more opportunities for coffee, visioning, learning and undoubtedly more great food. Let's get ready to party with the Holy Spirit in 2024.



Why Collect Pop Tabs?

Because it is so easy! The tabs on aluminum cans are small, can easily be removed and are easy to store. You may wonder why we collect just the tabs. Whole aluminum cans are both difficult to store and deliver. Tabs are smaller, easier to store and are easier to handle in large volumes. Collecting pop tabs is a great way to teach others about philanthropy and the importance of recycling while raising money to help children and their families at the same time.

What Do We Do with Pop Tabs?

We take the tabs to a local recycling company and receive money for each pound of tabs collected. It takes approximately 1,200 tabs to equal one pound. Through this recycling program, we can raise funds to continue providing a "home away from home" for families.

How Can I Collect Tabs?

By encouraging your class, group, church, business or organization to collect pop tabs, you can help us help families going through the toughest time of their lives. Every little bit helps! Collect your tabs in any way you would like—in coffee cans, plastic bags, boxes, buckets, or any other container with a wide opening. Set up a competition between groups to see who can collect the most!

Where Do I Take the Pop Tabs?

There is a a 'Pop Tab House' located in the library where you can put any collect tabs that you have and we will donate them!
